How to arrive to Vila-seca



By Bus

From the Airport to Sants Station or Tarragona:

Depending on the time and day, there may be direct bus services from the airport to Tarragona, or you may need to take a bus to Sants Station in Barcelona and then change to another bus or train towards Tarragona.

<u>Plana</u> is one company that offers routes that may include stops in cities near Vila-seca or in Vila-seca itself.

By Train

From the Airport to Sants Station:

Take the R2 Nord train service from the airport's train station to Sants Station in Barcelona. Trains usually depart approximately every 30 minutes. Travel time: About 20 minutes.

From Sants Station to Vila-seca:

At Sants Station, switch to a medium-distance train (R₁₆) or a long-distance service heading towards Tarragona or further south, <u>ensuring</u> the train stops at Vila-seca.

Travel time: About 1 hour and 10 minutes, depending on the service.

General Tips

From Tarragona to Vila-Seca: If you arrive in Tarragona by bus or train, you can take a local or short-distance train or bus to Vila-Seca. Check the local bus or the R14, R15, or R16 trains that stop at Vila-Seca.

Tickets: Purchasing tickets in advance is advisable, especially for long-distance trains requiring seat reservations.

Schedules and Routes: Always verify schedules and routes on your travel day, as there can be last-minute changes or cancellations.









How to arrive to faculty

The university campus is located away from the urban centre of Vila-Seca, between the town and PortAventura. It is accessible on foot from the centre of Vila-seca and the PortAventura train station. Whether you're coming from the heart of Vila-Seca or travelling by train, the campus is easily reachable, providing a perfect balance between academic pursuits and leisure activities.

In and around Vila-seca, there are plenty of activities to engage in after a day of training. Whether you're into history, nature, or entertainment, this region offers a diverse set of options:

- Visit PortAventura World: One of Europe's largest theme parks near Vila-seca and URV's faculty.
- 2. Explore Tarragona: A short drive away,
 Tarragona is known for its well-preserved Roman
 ruins, including the Amphitheatre, the Forum,
 and the Pont del Diable aqueduct. The city's old
 town is also lovely to wander, with narrow
 streets, ancient buildings, and a beautiful
 cathedral.
- Relax on the Beach: The Costa Daurada boasts beautiful beaches.
- 4. **Discover Reus:** The birthplace of the architect Antoni Gaudí, Reus has a charming town centre with several modernist buildings. The Gaudí Centre Reus Museum is dedicated to his life and work, providing insights into his architectural genius.
- Wine Tasting in Priorat: If you're willing to venture further, the Priorat wine region is known for its high-quality wines. Many vineyards offer tours and tastings, where you can learn about wine-making and sample local produce.
- 6. Visit the Monastery of Poblet: This UNESCO World Heritage Site is one of the world's largest and most complete Cistercian abbeys. It's within an hour's drive from Vila-seca and offers a fascinating glimpse into medieval monastic life.
- 7. Enjoy Local Cuisine: The Costa Daurada is renowned for its seafood and traditional Catalan dishes. Try specialities like "xató," a salad with anchovies, tuna, and an almond-based sauce, or "arròs negre," a squid ink rice dish.
